*For conspicuous gallantry and exceptionally meritorious  
conduct at the risk of life above and beyond the call of duty.*

On November 24, 2024, Officer Quiterio with the Kimberly-Hansen Police Department responded to assist the Twin Falls County Sheriff's Office with a suicidal male at the Hansen Bridge. Once on scene, Officer Quiterio located the male unconscious on the Snake River Canyon's edge with part of his body over the edge. While waiting for assistance from the Fire Department, Officer Quiterio rushed to the edge of the cliff where he immediately began rescue efforts to bring the subject to safety. Officer Quiterio was mere inches from the edge of the canyon when the subject regained consciousness and became combative. Even facing approximately 350 feet fall into the canyon, Officer Quiterio did not leave the edge until the subject was secured by a strap and assisted by others to a safe location.

Through indomitable courage, complete disregard for his own safety, and profound concern for the safety of others, Officer Brian Quiterio showed great determination and bravery. Officer Quiterio's extraordinary heroism and intrepidity, with danger to his own life above and beyond the call of duty, are in the highest traditions of the Kimberly-Hansen Police Department and Idaho law enforcement.
